Celebrating Community Spirit Through Blossoms and Blooms In an effort to bring our community closer and celebrate the beauty of nature, our village is delighted to announce the inaugural Best Garden and Sunflower Competition. This event is designed to encourage residents to showcase their gardening talents, foster a love for horticulture, and enhance the aesthetic appeal of our village.

Best Sunflower

Open to all residents, this category will award the tallest, most vibrant sunflower. Judges will consider the flower's height, colour, and overall health.

To enter you must be a resident of St Mary's to allow judging without travelling 20 miles and more!!

Judging will take place during the first week of August.

Judging Criteria

A panel will judge each garden based on the following criteria:

- Creativity: Original and innovative design concepts.
- Plant Variety: A diverse range of plant species and varieties.
- Maintenance: Health and care of plants, including pruning and weeding.
- Sustainability: Use of environmentally friendly practices.
- Overall Aesthetic: Visual appeal and harmony of the garden.

How to Enter

Participation in the competition is open to all village residents. To enter, please follow these steps:

- Submit an entry form from the show schedule.
- Include a brief description of your garden.
- Attach up to five photographs of your garden and/or sunflower.
- Submit your entry by the deadline, which is 30th June 2025.

Get your gardening gloves ready, and let the competition begin!

Produce and Craft Show Rules

A Schedule of Classes will be published listing the Classes for the Show.

All exhibits to be grown, produced, or made by the Exhibitor.

Enter the Show by completing an entry form.

Email the form or send a printed form to the Show Secretary by Sunday 24th August 2025 to wsmpclerk@btinternet.com or drop off at WSM Community Hall letterbox or at Wainfleet Pet Shop.

The Show Day starts at 8.30am when you bring your produce to the Community Hall marquee. All entries must be submitted by 10:15am.

You collect (at the entrance to the marquee) an entry card for each Class you have entered.

Each Class will have a numbered table.

You place your entry card for that Class, face down at the base of your entry.

The judges will use this card to note any comments about your exhibit and award prizes.

If you know the name of the particular variety of your exhibit, you are encouraged to write this on a card and display it alongside your exhibit.

You must then clear the hall by 10.30am for the judging to commence.

Judging takes place from 11am to 12 noon.

The hall then reopens 1pm for anyone to come and view the exhibits.

At 2.30pm the Awards will be made, Raffle Drawn and any exhibits not removed will be auctioned off.

Entries cannot show any name or marking that would identify the entrant to the Judges.

All exhibits not removed by 3.30pm on the day of the Show shall be deemed to become a gift from the exhibitor and will normally be disposed of by auction for the benefit of future Village Shows.

Judges are appointed by the Committee and may at their discretion cut, taste, or otherwise test any exhibit. The judges shall disqualify any exhibit which does not conform to the requirements of the Schedule. They have discretion to award up to but not exceeding 3 prizes for each <u>Class</u>. Rosettes will be given for 1st, 2nd and 3rd places in each class.

Points: Three points are awarded for 1st place, two points for 2nd place and one point for 3rd place. Points are added together for each entrant, and this will determine the 1st, 2nd and 3rd place for each <u>Category</u> for which a trophy will be awarded.
